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

Minutes of Debriefing Session on Response during Balasore Train Accident

- A Debriefing session for Response during Balasore Train Accident was organized on 13th July 2023 at 1500 Hrs under the Chairmanship of Member& Secretary I/C, NDMA at NDMA Bhawan.
- 2. The list of participants is annexed.
- 3. At the outset, Advisor (Ops & Comn), NDMA welcomed all participants and briefed about the purpose and agenda of the meeting. The aim was to deliberate upon the gaps identified, lessons learnt and best practices followed and to provide a platform for all stakeholders for sharing key takeaways and mutual learnings in order to further improve our Disaster Management plans, SOPs, protocols and procedures to achieve our goal of effective, efficient and comprehensive response to disaster situations / emergencies. Member & Secretary I/C, NDMA and Member (SAH) delivered opening remarks and appreciated the coordinated efforts of all the responders and stakeholders for carrying out rescue and relief operations in the immediate aftermath of unfortunate train accident on 02 June 2023 at Bahanaga Railway Station in Distt Balasore (Odisha). The timely and relentless rescue and relief efforts of State Govt of Odisha, OSDMA, ODRAF and Distt Administration Balasore saved precious lives and was appreciated by all and put on record.
- Presentations were delivered by GM (Safety) MoR, RPF, DG (FS, CD & HG) Govt
 of Odisha and NDRF followed by experience sharing by DM / Collector, Distt
 Balasore, Special Relief Commissioner, Govt of Odisha and HQ IDS (MoD).

After detailed deliberations following actions were recommended to be taken:

(a) There is a need of better Inter-agency coordination under the umbrella of Incident Commander / Responsible Officer as per Incident Response System (IRS).

(Action by: All States/UTs/Distts and Ministry of Railway (MOR)

(b) IRS Training will be conducted by NDMA, NDRF and NIDM for Indian Railways authorities. Railways may project their plan/schedule to NDMA / NDRF / NIDM.

(Action by: NDMA, NDRF, NIDM and MoR)

(c) Inventory on IDRN portal must be updated and utilized with special emphasis on resources available with PSUs and Pvt Sector Industries,

(Action by: All States/UTs/Distts and NIDM)

(d) NDMA, NDRF, State Government and Distt Administration must involve Indian Railways functionaries in Multi State / State level / UT level / Distt level MEs alongwith all the stakeholders for better preparedness and coordination during disasters / emergencies. Similarly, Railway authorities must involve State authorities, Distt Administration, Response Forces and all stakeholders in their Mock Exercises.

(Action by: All States/UTs/Distts, MoR, NDRF and NDMA)

(e) Responsibilities of field level functionaries of Railways must be incorporated in Distt DM Plans and State DM Plans.

(Action by: All States/UTs/Distts and MoR)

(f) NDMA, NDRF, State Government and Distt Administration should also involve PSUs during Multi State / State level / UT level / Distt level MEs. (Action by: All States/UTs/Distts, NDMA, NDRF and NIDM)

(g) Modernisation of First Responders / Response Forces in terms of Equipment and Training may be carried out. Latest State-of-the-Art, light weight, portable equipment may be explored and procured as per procedure.

(Action by: NDRF, SDRF of all States/UTs and MoR)

(h) NDRF should equip and train their teams with Equipment / tools useful for rescue during train accidents in consultation with Indian Railways.

(Action by: NDRF, MoR and MHA)

(i) NDRF to create more RRCs with their footprints pan India to have early access to the incident site and enable rescue of affected people during golden hour.

(Action by: NDRF, NDMA and MHA)

(j) Identified Railway vehicles / Disaster Response Emergency vehicles need to be given free emergency lanes at toll plazas as per the practice being followed in the case of other emergency vehicles like Fire & Emergency Service, Police, Ambulance etc. Ministry of Railways (MoR) will moot a proposal in this regard and NDMA will take up the issue with NHAI (MoRTH).

(k) Enforcement of Green Corridor for response teams to the incident site should be resorted to during disasters.

(Action by: All States/UTs)

(I) Location of dead bodies to be recorded for ease of identification. Also assistance of DNA and finger printing technology should be taken for Identification of dead bodies.

(Action by: All States/UTs/Distts and MoR)

(m) Air assets may be requisitioned timely so that the resources of IAF may be best utilized during day time for response and relief operations.

(Action by: All States/UTs/Distts and HQ-IDS)

(n) VIP movements at disaster response site hinders the rescue and relief efforts. Therefore, vantage points / viewpoints may be selected away from disaster site but overlooking the incident site and briefing may be done accordingly.

(Action by: All States/UTs, NDRF)

(o) For effective command and control and robust communication, command vehicles capable of performing the functions of onsite command post may be procured. Such system exists in Indian Army and the same can be replicated.

(Action by: All States/UTs, NDRF and HQ-IDS)

(p) Priority Call Routing (PCR) process has been automated. SDMAs may take up requisition providing list of officials for obtaining PCR facility as per laid down SOP.

(Action by: All States/UTs/Distts)

(q) Refrigerated containers / vessels / vans may be explored for dealing with dead bodies in a dignified manner.

(Action by: All States/UTs/Distts)

- (r) NIDM has been assigned the responsibility of documenting the feedback, gaps identified, lessons learnt and best practices etc. All stakeholders are requested to share necessary inputs with NIDM.
- (Action by: NIDM, Govt. of Odisha, Distt- Balasore, NDRF, ODRAF, RPF, & MoR)
- 6. The Meeting ended with a vote of thanks to the chair and all participants.
