
International Women's Day

International Women's Day is celebrated annually on March 8th around the world. In 1910 German activist Clara Zetkin convinced the International Socialist Congress to create an international version of the American holiday. On March 19, 1911, the first International Women's Day was held in four European countries. On 9 August 1956, about 20,000 women marched to the Union Buildings in Pretoria to protest legislation aimed tightening the apartheid at government's control over the movement of black women in urban areas.





It is a day when women are recognized for their achievements without regard to divisions, whether national, ethnic, linguistic, cultural, economic or political. Each year the UN adopts a theme as a way to highlight a specific issue and focus attention. It is one of the most important days of the year to: celebrate women's achievements, educate, awareness raise for women's equality and call for positive change advancing women.




Fig: 1 Ten values that guide International Women's Day

On South Central Railway, Vijayawada Division, there are 1726 women employees i.e. 9.3% of total workforce.





Fig: 2 Percentage of Women in total workforce

Fig: 3 Women employees age wise.




Fig: 4 Department-wise Women employees

Among 1726 women employees; 66% of them are working in safety departments and 34% are in Non-safety departments

687 employees are posted in head quarter area (Vijayawada) and 1039 are working in field units.




Fig:5 women employees working in HQ and field
